CLUB OFFICERS' COMPETITION

Handicap Stableford

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following conditions for this competition must be read in conjunction with **CAGU's "General Conditions"** which are published on and downloadable from the website (www.cagu.co.uk).

The Local Rules of the host club shall be used throughout this competition.

When entering a competition, clubs should, in particular, be aware of the General Conditions covering eligibility, entries, withdrawals and registration.

A. THE COMPETITION

1. **All CAGU affiliated clubs** may enter one or two teams in this competition.
2. **A club team** will comprise three players, all of whom must be an officer of the club concerned e.g. President, Chairman, Captain, Vice-Captain, immediate Past Captain, Junior Captain, Club Secretary/Manager/Administrator, Treasurer, Handicap/Match/ Competitions Organiser.
3. **Handicaps.** All players must have a current "competition" handicap.
4. **Format.**
 - a. 18 holes individual stableford competition with full handicap allowance off yellow (male) or red (female) tees.
 - b. The winning team shall be the team with the best aggregate stableford score for two players.
 - c. In the event of a tie using the first 2 cards, the third card will be added to establish the best aggregate score. In the event there is still a tie, it will be decided according to General Condition 18b (countback) using the third card. All other ties in this competition will also be decided by General Condition 18b on the third card.
5. **Caddies.** A professional golfer may not act as a caddie. In the case of juniors (under 18 on 1 January of the year in which the competition is played) parents or other relatives may not act as a caddie.
6. **Team captains** shall not be professional golfers and must be members of the club concerned. They may either be a playing or non-playing captain. (See also CAGU General Conditions 14).

B. ASSOCIATED ARRANGEMENTS

1. **The venue** will be determined each year by the Competition Organiser.
2. **Entries** must be made on the official entry form, accompanied by entry fees. The fee includes a meal following play and is payable for each player.

C. THE COMPETITION ORGANISER is the CAGU Assistant Competitions Secretary, through whom all entries and communications should be directed:

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
