### CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following conditions for this competition must be read in conjunction with:

- i. CAGU's "General Conditions"
- ii. CAGU's "Hard Card" (Standard Local Rules, Conditions of Competition, Regulations and Safety Advice)

Both these documents are published on and downloadable from the website ([www.cagu.co.uk](http://www.cagu.co.uk)). Players should download and carry in their golf bags a copy of the Hard Card. Note: The Links' Local Rules shall be used for this competition. Other sections of the Hard Card will be in effect for the competition.

When entering a competition, players should, in particular, be aware of the General Conditions covering eligibility, entries and withdrawals.

Note: After entries close, CAGU's Competitions Secretary will send by e-mail (or, by exception, post) to each pair's nominated contact a copy of the draw, including contact details, and these Conditions of Competition. These documents will also be on the website.

#### 1. The Competition

- a. **Format.** Scratch foursomes match play knock-out played over a period determined by CAGU's Competitions Secretary. Each match shall be played over 18 holes. If there is a tie after 18 holes, the match shall continue from the first hole played, on a hole-by-hole ("sudden death") basis until a side wins a hole.
- b. **Venue.** The Links GC, Newmarket. The Club gives courtesy of the course for each match. Such courtesy does not extend to practice rounds.
- c. **Maximum entries:** 64 pairs. If entries exceed 64, they shall be reduced to 64 by eliminating the higher handicaps by ballot according to exact handicaps submitted on entry forms.
- d. **Player eligibility/qualification:** See General Condition 3. In addition, at date of entry, each player must have a handicap not exceeding 10.4.

#### 2. Arranging Matches

- a. Both sides shall arrange their own matches. They share responsibility for contacting each other as soon as possible to arrange the match.

- b. Both sides in a match to be arranged shall agree which of them will contact the Club Secretary at The Links (Tel: 01638 663000) to arrange a date and tee time. Such contact must be made at least eight days in advance. Matches will commence at the hole decided by the Club Secretary.
- c. Each round must be played by the date specified on the drawsheet. If it isn't, both pairs are eliminated, unless one pair concedes the match to the other. No extensions shall be granted.
- d. The winners of a match must enter the result on the sheet in the Club's men's changing room and e-mail or phone the result to CAGU's Competitions Secretary. The winners must then contact their opponents in the next round, when known, as soon as possible.

### **3. Winners and Prizes**

- a. The winners shall be presented with the Cup and winners' prizes after the Final.
- b. The runners up shall also receive prizes.
- c. Where prizes are in the form of vouchers, their value shall be decided by the Competition Committee.
