THE JUNIOR CHAMPION CLUB

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following conditions for this competition must be read in conjunction with:

- i. CAGU's "General Conditions"
- ii. CAGU's "Hard Card" (Standard Local Rules, Conditions of Competition, Regulations and Safety Advice)

Both these documents are published on and downloadable from the website (www.cagu.co.uk). Players should download and carry in their golf bags a copy of the Hard Card.

Note: Caddies are prohibited in all junior competitions.

The Local Rules of the host club shall be used throughout this competition. However, other sections of the Hard Card will be in effect.

When entering a competition, clubs should, in particular, be aware of the General Conditions covering eligibility, entries, withdrawals and registration.

After entries close, the Competition Organiser will e-mail each club a copy of the draw and these Conditions of Competition, which will also be on the website.

A THE COMPETITION

1. **Entry** to this competition is open to all CAGU affiliated clubs. A club may enter one junior team of three players (boys, girls or mixed). There will be an entry fee, which must be sent to the Competition Organiser on entering the competition.
2. **Format.** Individual stableford off full handicap.
3. **Handicaps.**
 - a. Each team member must have a "competition" handicap.
 - b. Each player must have a handicap not exceeding 28 (boys) or 36 (girls).
4. **Player eligibility/qualification.** See CAGU's General condition 3.
 - a. In particular, a player must be under 18 at 00:00 hours on 1 January of the year in which the competition is to be played.

- b. In addition, a player may only represent his/her “home” club, which is the player’s club for handicapping purposes.
 - c. Also, the player shall not have played for any other CAGU or C&HLCGA club in any CAGU or C&HLCGA inter-club competition in the same calendar year.
5. **Practice.** Courtesy of the host club’s course shall not be granted for practice rounds.
 6. **Tees.** Boys will play from the club’s white (competition) tees, girls from the red tees.
 7. **The winning club** shall be the team with the highest aggregate net stableford score over 18 holes, taking the best two scores out of three.
 8. **Ties.** In the event of a tie, the third stableford score will count and the tie will be decided on the 18 holes aggregate total of all three scores. If still tied, General Condition 10b (countback) will apply to stableford scores on the third card. If still tied, the same shall apply to the second best card and, if necessary, the best card.

B. Winner and Prizes

1. Mementoes shall be awarded to each member of the winning and runners-up teams.
2. The Winning Club shall represent CAGU in England Golf’s Junior Champion Club Tournament later in the season.
