CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following conditions for this Championship must be read in conjunction with **CAGU's** "**General Conditions**" which are published on and downloadable from the website (www.cagu.co.uk).

The Local Rules of the host club shall be used throughout this competition


When entering a competition, players should, in particular, be aware of the General Conditions covering eligibility, entries, withdrawals and registration.

Note: After entries close, the Competition Organiser will send by e-mail (or, by exception, post) to club team organisers and those officiating at the Championship a "Players' Information" sheet and a drawsheet. Players Information will include such matters as contact details of the Competition Organiser and the Club, catering arrangements and any additional dress code requirements e.g. for the meal on completion of play.

A. The Championship

- 1. **Format**. The Championship is a club team competition which shall be played by 18 holes of individual stableford stroke play off yellow tees.
- 2. **A club team** shall comprise three players (See 8 below).
- 3. **Handicap Qualifying Round**. The round shall be a qualifying round for handicap. Scores will be remitted to clubs by the Competition Organiser. However, each player is also responsible for reporting his score to his home club.
- 4. **Handicap**. Players must have an "competition" handicap. The maximum handicap allowance is 24. Players with handicaps in excess of 24 are welcome but shall play off 24.
- 5. **Maximum Field**. Only limited by the number of CAGU clubs: All affiliated clubs are invited to enter a team.

- 6. **Courtesy practice rounds** are not available before this Championship.
- 7. **The winners** shall be the team with the best aggregate stableford score for two players. In the event of a tie using the first 2 cards, the third card will be added to establish the best aggregate score. In the event there is still a tie, it will be decided according to General Condition 18b (countback) using the third card. All other ties in this competition will also be decided by General Condition 18b on the third card.
- 8. **Player eligibility/qualification**: See General Condition 3. In addition, all three players must be aged 55 or over and one of them must be 70 or over on the day of the Championship. The club they represent must be their "home" club for handicap purposes.
- 9. **Team Captains** shall not be professional golfers and must be members of the club concerned. They may be either a playing or a non-playing captain. (See also CAGU General Conditions 14).
- 10. **Caddies**: A professional golfer may not be a caddie.

B. Winner and Prizes

- a. The winning team shall be presented with the Trophy and winners' prizes on completion of play.
- b. The runners up shall also receive prizes and a prize will be awarded to the player with the best individual net score.

C. Associated Arrangements

- 1. **Entries.** Clubs shall enter by way of the entry form sent to and available from each club's seniors' organiser. The entry fee must be enclosed with the form and posted to the Competition Organiser.
- 2. **Competition Organiser:** is the CAGU Assistant Competition Secretary. All entries and communications should be directed through him.
